Saint Augustine of Hippo-Feast Day August 28

St. Augustine was born in 354 in a small town near Hippo,
North Africa. Hippo was an ancient port city in what is now Algeria.
His father worshipped a pagan religion and his mother was Christian.
His father died when Augustine was only 16 years old.

During his early years he followed an ancient philosophy known as Marichaeism, which disappointed his mother to no end. He was well

educated and traveled to Rome and Milan. He was a professor while in Milan. During his travels he converted to Catholicism in 386 at the age of 32. He converted after studying sacred scriptures and the life of St. Anthony, a hermit

He returned to Hippo and was ordained a priest at the age of 37 and then two years later became the Bishop of Hippo. St. Augustine was a prolific writer. Two of his books, *Confessions* and *The City of God* are still popular today. He was recognized as one of the first Doctors of the Church. These doctors were saints who made a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through their teaching, study and writing. He is considered the patron saint of brewers, printers and theologians.

I found several of his sayings very thoughtful. Here are three I thought you might like: "Faith is to believe what you do not see, the reward for this faith is to see what you believe; The world is a book and those who do not travel read only one page, To fall in love with God is the greatest romance, to seek him the greatest adventure, to find him the greatest achievement."

St. Augustine died in Hippo at the age of 74.
